

TEFAF New York 2022 Unveils Masterworks Across All Collecting Categories














Hemmerle presents Cameo earrings. The onyx intaglios are set in anodised aluminium that perfectly complements the tonal perspective of the natural stone.



Exhibitor stands will flow throughout the Armory's landmark building encompassing the Wade Thompson Drill Hall and extending to both the first and second floors of the Armory's period rooms, creating a fair of unprecedented depth and impact in New York City.
