Each of these almost 300 specialist exhibitors will present one "masterpiece" representing their respective areas of expertise. Gagosian, New York, will display *Cherubs,* 1991, by Jeff Koons (USA, b.1955), a significant and impressively detailed polychromed wood sculpture in two parts.

ArtAncient, London, will showcase *Bust of a young Herakles*, Late Hellenistic period, 1st century BC, which once belonged to the collection of George Granville Sutherland-Leveson-Gower, 2nd Duke of Sutherland.

Di Donna Galleries, a New York gallery specializing in European and American art from 1900 to 1970, will display *Interior with a Woman Standing*, 1913, by Vilhelm Hammershøi (Denmark, 1864-1916), a painter who held a remarkable position in the course of modernism by depicting subtle gradations of color and emotionally charged interiors.

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Bergamin & Gomide, São Paulo, will offer the rare and remarkable work *Idílio*, 1929, by eminent Brazilian modernist painter Tarsila do Amaral (Brazil, 1886-1973) for an asking price of \$7,000,000.

Walter Padovani, Milan, specializing in Ancient Art will display Rinaldo Rinaldi's (Italy, 1793-1873) *Justice and Peace Embrace*, 1845, a terracotta piece from the prestigious collection of the Earls of Harewood, who are related to the royal family through King George V's only daughter Mary, the Princess Royal.
